




Ancient Galilee Boat

The remains of the Ancient Galilee Boat were found by two brothers, both fishermen and amateur archaeologists, with an interest in discovering artifacts from Israel's past. Due to a drought causing a reduced water-level, the brothers found in the exposed beach the remains of the boat, which had been buried in the shore. An archaeological dig was undertaken by members of Kibbutz Ginosar, the Israel Antiquities Authority, and numerous volunteers. The "Jesus Boat" is now displayed at the Yigal Allon Galilee Boat Museum in Kibbutz Ginosar.

Set within the Banias Nature Reserve in the Golan, the Banias is a spring which rises from the base of Mount Hermon, Israel's tallest mountain, flowing for about 3.5 km through a gorge, eventually coming to the impressive waterfall, the largest in Israel.

Holocaust: the murder of 6 million Jews by Nazi Germany in about 4 and a half years.

Holocaust History Museum occupies over 4,200 square meters, mainly underground.

Underground layers of the Western Wall of the Temple Mount, under what is today the Old City's Muslim Quarter. Excavation work began on this tunnel by Orthodox rabbis after the Six Day War in 1967. Reaching the north end of the Temple Mount compound in the late 1980's, they connected with a pre-Herodian second and first century B.C. water tunnel. In 1996 an exit was opened leading onto the Via Dolorosa in the Muslim quarter of the Old City.

Western "Wailing" Wall

And this will be the sign for you: you will find the baby wrapped in strips of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly army, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among people with whom he is pleased!"

This monumental fortress and palace was built on the highest hill in the Judean desert, 15 KM south of Jerusalem and 5 KM southeast of Bethlehem.

Built in the years 23–20 BC

Built with smooth stones and has a circular structure, with four towers on each direction

Herodium

The fortress built by Herod the Great that eventually became his burial place.

The Roman Cardo: This ancient street in the heart of the Jewish Quarter was the typical kind of street for Roman cities. In its grandeur, it was an exceptionally wide colonnaded street running through the heart of Jerusalem on a north-south axis, beginning at the Damascus Gate in the north and ending in the southern area near the Zion Gate. Being the main thoroughfare through Roman cities, the Cardo was often flanked by colorful stalls and shops carrying all kinds of goods for sale.

There are six Hellenistic/Roman style remnants of houses found in this neighborhood of the Jewish Quarter of the Old City. Temple priests and other affluent families lived in this area during the Second Temple era.

Also, this is a possible site where Jesus stood mute before the High Priest and was condemned.

Interesting Facts About Israel

- Flag: The colors blue and white were chosen according to the Jewish prayer shawl. The Star of David appears in the center of the flag and has been a Jewish symbol for hundreds of years.
- State Emblem: The official emblem of the State of Israel is the Menorah a candelabrum. It is flanked by two olive branches that symbolize Israel's longing for peace.
- Official languages: Hebrew, Arabic.
- Capital: Jerusalem. Israel proclaimed Jerusalem as its capital in 1950. On December 6, 2017, the United States recognized Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. The U.S. Embassy moved from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem opening on May 14, 2018, the 70th anniversary of the creation of the modern State of Israel
- Israel's Declaration of Independence is May 14, 1948.
- The governing system is Democratic.
- The Israel Defense Forces (IDF): The Israeli army is comprised of compulsory reserve and career service. All eligible men and women are drafted at age 18, three years for men and two years for women. Men are liable for reserve duty until age 51 and women until age 24.
- Size: Israel could fit into Texas 32 times. It is slightly smaller than New Jersey. It is 263 miles long (north to south), and the width (east to west) ranges from 9 to 71 miles.
- Population Figures: In April 2019, Israel's population stood at 8,556,000 people according to figures released by the Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS).
- Some 75.3% are Jewish; 20.6% are Arabs; those not identified as either make up the remaining 4.1% of the population. Today, over 70% of the total Jewish



population are "Sabras"—born in Israel—compared with 35% native-born in 1948.

• The Jewish Religion is expressed in various ways in Israel:

Cultural Jew: Considered to be Jewish by ethnicity but not by religious practice.

Orthodox Jew: Adhere to the basic tenets in life and practice.

The Hasidic Community: A special movement of ultra-Orthodox Judaism that began in the 1700s in Eastern Europe. On the streets of Jerusalem particularly, you will notice Jewish men wearing beards, sidelocks, black hats, and long coats. Women cover up completely with scarves or other head coverings and wear modest dresses.

Messianic Jew: Jewish believers in Jesus. They recognize that the prophecies of the coming Messiah written in the Hebrew Bible find their fulfillment in the life of Jesus, Y'shua.

- Israel leads the world in the numbers of scientists and technicians in the workforce, with 145 per 10,000.
- Israeli bank notes have brail on them so the blind can identify them.
- Israel has more in-vitro fertilization per capita than anywhere in the world, and it's free.
- Israel has the highest number of companies listed on the U.S. Stock Exchange after the U.S. and Canada.
- Israel is the only democracy in the Middle East.
- Over the past 25 years agricultural output has increased sevenfold with hardly any increase in the amount of water used.

- Israel has a higher life expectancy, lower average infant mortality rate and almost double the amount of doctors per patient ratio than the U.S.
- The glue on the back of Israeli stamps is kosher.
- Israel's \$316.5 billion economy is the second largest economy in its region.
- In 1984 and 1991, Israel airlifted a total of 22,000 Ethiopian Jews at risk in Ethiopia to safety in Israel.
- When Golda Meir was elected Prime Minister of Israel in 1969, she became the world's second elected female leader in modern times.
- Relative to its population, Israel is the largest immigrant-absorbing nation on earth. Immigrants come in search of democracy, religious freedom, and economic opportunity.
- In 1991, during the Gulf War, the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra played a concert wearing gas masks as scud missiles fired by Saddam Hussein fell on Tel Aviv.
- In response to serious water shortages, Israeli engineers and agriculturalists developed a revolutionary drip irrigation system to minimize the amount of water used to grow crops.
- The cell phone was developed in Israel.
- Voice mail technology was developed in Israel.
- The technology for AOL Instant Messenger was developed in 1996 by four young Israelis.




